Assessing the Situation

The triennial reassessment notices, we have been informed by the Cook County Assessor's Office, should be mailed on April 18, 2019. You will have 30 days to file an assessed value complaint if you feel your assessed value is incorrect. The predominant grounds for such a complaint are "lack of uniformity." That means that other homes like yours (same classification) and are in close proximity to yours (in your neighborhood), are valued at a lower value (usually price per square foot). An appraisal is also helpful. We would be happy to research comparable homes to assist you in filing your appeal.



Another valid reason to appeal is that your characteristics, as recorded on your reassessment notice, are incorrect. A plat of survey, appraisal and pictures are helpful.

If you purchased your home in the past three years, a closing statement showing the sales price is an additional aid to determining the correct value.

If you have experienced a fire, flood, or catastrophic event, you must provide a detailed description of the damages, dates when the damage occurred, the estimated date of completion for repairs or rebuilding, all pertinent records that include, photographs, insurance reports, building permits, and occupancy certificates.

We will be hosting A Reassessment Seminar with the Cook County Assessor's Office, sponsored by Senator Laura Murphy and other elected representatives, on Monday, April 29th from 6 pm to 9 pm at the Elk Grove Township Hall, 2400 S Arlington Hts. Rd. This will be an opportunity for you to learn more and meet your elected officials. At the same time, my staff will be available to help you file your assessment appeal.

Depending upon the outcome of your appeal, you will have a second chance to appeal when we are open for the Cook County Board of Review. This will take place approximately 90-120 days after we close for appeals in Elk Grove Township. We will keep you posted as to when that will occur. At that time, we will host another outreach seminar for your convenience.

It would be our pleasure to personally notify you by email or phone if you supply us with that information. That information will be used for no other purpose. Just call or come in and we will add you to our list.

Clerk's Corner

Have you ever wondered what it is that townships do? Township government is the oldest existing unit of government on the North American continent and considered the closest form of government to the people. By law, Illinois Townships are charged with three basic functions:



1.) **General Assistance for the indigent:** Townships provide the final safety net for the community's needy. Elk Grove Township offers emergency and on-going financial assistance, employment counseling/resources, dental services, food pantry, senior/disabled transportation, and counseling, in addition to a network of referrals to other organizations for mental health issues, spousal and child abuse, homelessness, etc.

2.) **The assessment of real property for the basis of local taxation:** Townships help taxpayers with managing their tax burden through counseling and appeals right in their own neighborhood.

3.) **Maintenance of all roads and bridges outside federal, state and other local jurisdiction:** Townships keep their communities going by maintaining unincorporated area roads and drainage. Elk Grove Township also provides seasonal brush pick-up in the unincorporated areas.

News from your Highway Commissioner

BRANCH PICK-UP

Branch pick-up is offered in residential areas on the streets maintained by the Township ONLY (unincorporated areas) from April through October (weather permitting) on the 15th of each month. If the 15th falls on a holiday or weekend, branch pick-up will be scheduled for the following work day. The branch program is designed so that the township can help unincorporated residents keep their properties clean after storm damage. If property owners have extremely large amounts of brush, crews will only remove a portion of the brush.

We ask you to limit your piles to storm and wind damaged branches and not to exceed two cubic yards. If a landscaping or tree service takes down trees or branches on your property, they are responsible for its disposal. Please also remember your waste disposal company will pick up branches that are bundled and tied. Please do not begin stacking branches near the streets immediately after the township crews have finished in your area (16th of the month). Piling of branches after the pickup date creates an eyesore, causes damage to grassy areas, and invites animals, pests, mosquitos etc.

What will be picked up:

- Branches with a minimum 2' length, maximum 12' length and less than a 6" diameter.

What will NOT be picked up:

- Small hedge or pine clippings
- Yard waste or brush in containers
- Brush or branches with thorns
- Stumps or tree roots

How to stack the brush:

- Neatly stack the branches in one direction with the butt end toward the street.
- No lumber, wire, rope, or other material may be included with branches.
- Please do not place brush on another resident's property, if this happens please contact the Cook County Sherriff's office, not Elk Grove Township, the township does not have authority in such matters
- Once we have gone through an area, we will not return until the next scheduled date.



WE NEED YOU!

Elk Grove Township Food Pantry is going through some major changes and we need your help.

In the last 3 years, the food pantry usage has grown 291%! As we move into our new space, the food pantry will be transitioned to a "client choice" pantry. That means that when clients come to visit, rather than receiving pre-packed bags with their items, they will be given a shopping cart and allowed to "shop" our pantry.

There are numerous reasons for this change to "client choice." First, there will be less waste since clients will be able to choose the items that their family enjoys and that fit into their overall dietary needs. This helps us by limiting our spending of donated funds to those items that our clients prefer.

Second, because we will have more space, it will allow us to put a greater focus on perishable foods like milk, eggs, meat and healthy produce. We are excited to be offering healthier options for our residents.

Lastly, and most importantly, our new pantry allows our clients the dignity of choice. Each client that comes to our pantry is always welcomed and treated as a valued resident. Our new procedures will ensure that each client is given the attention they need to make the best choices for them.

This is where YOU come in! There is no way that we can staff this new pantry alone. We will need DOZENS of volunteers to make it happen.

Highway Department:

The role of the Highway Department is the care and maintenance of the roads in the unincorporated parts of Elk Grove Township. This includes repair and snow removal.

In addition to the road maintenance, the Highway Department also does brush pick for residents of the unincorporated areas of the township.

Transportation Services:

Dial a ride: Senior residents of Elk Grove Township age 55 and older may use the DIAL-A-RIDE services. All buses are handicap accessible (i.e. walkers, wheelchairs, etc.).

T.R.I.P.: This program is the Northwest Suburban Cook County Inter-township Transportation for medical purposes for Senior Citizens and Persons with Disabilities.

Disability Transport Services: This program is our discounted cab service. Seniors 55 and older and people with permanent disabilities over the age of 18 are eligible.

Bike Safety: Bicycle Safety is provided by Elk Grove Township to all students of our Township. The program is funded by the taxpayers that live in our Township, and has been in existence for almost 30 years.

From the Parenting Toolbox



Perfectionism

The quest for something that cannot be found



Many of us, and far too many of our teens, are caught in a difficult force that can be unhelpful, and even debilitating.

Getting “straight A’s” in high school is a good goal, and it does open doors to preferred colleges and selective fields. Having some stress around these goals is not necessarily a bad thing, as many use this stress to excel.

But what if there is more than “some” stress? What if grades are merely a vehicle for trying to be “perfect.” In many of these instances it has less to do with perfecting things (grades, work, appearance) than it is an attempt to perfect an imperfect “self.”

This type of perfectionism can actually be disabling, and lead to procrastination or not getting important things done. Some self-talk may be “if I don’t start it, I cannot make a mistake.”

The origins of the unhelpful self-talk could, in some cases, stem for some early learning, and the unyielding quest can boil down to “if I am perfect, I won’t be rejected, ridiculed, abused or abandoned.” These can be powerful unconscious motivators that drive our actions.

Yet, people can overcome these forces by finding ways to develop better relationships with themselves. It is not unlike being aware of what a child needs, and (as a parent) giving it lovingly to them. A teen or adult can do that for themselves. They have these resources.

Sometimes, it helps to have a professional counselor or therapist assist with this discovery and growth. Elk Grove Township Youth and Family Services Department provides sliding fee-based counseling services to youth and their families. 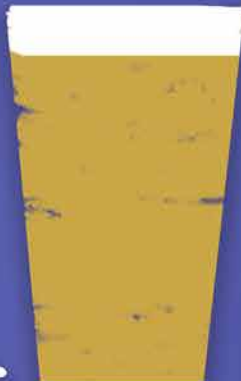
