TOWNSHIP OFFICES MOVING IN 2019



The Township's main offices that are currently located at 2400 S. Arlington Heights Road will be moving in the not too distant future to our new location at 600 Landmeier Road in Elk Grove Village (previously the Village Public Works facility). In early 2016 the process

was begun to explore opportunities to pursue a building that would better serve the residents' needs and could accommodate the number of growing services that the Township administers. Multiple Special Town Meetings were held whereby the Electors provided approval to sell three existing Township buildings (two of which were returned to the tax rolls) and purchase the Landmeier building in a building swap with Elk Grove Village. We are hard at work designing a building with expanded services to assist Township residents and will continue "Empowering People Through Community" as our logo states. Stay tuned for more details. Assessing the Situation

My staff and I hope that 2019 brings you good health and prosperity. We look forward to, as always, being your resource for property tax information and assisting you whenever we can, with exemptions and appeals. This year we will be experiencing the triennial reassessment for all properties in Elk Grove Township. As of this publication, we have not

been informed as to when the reassessment notices will be sent out. When you receive this notice from the Cook County Assessor, you will have 30 days in which to file an appeal. If you need assistance with researching comparable properties and filing your appeal, we are here to help you through the process. When we receive notice from the county assessor, we will send out an email and/or call to those taxpayers who have given us their email or phone numbers. If you would like to be included in these notifications, call our office at 47-437-0300, ask for the Assessor's office and my staff will put you on our list.

Your second opportunity to appeal will follow approximately 90-120 days later when the Cook County Board of Review opens for appeals. Again, we'll send out notifications regarding when we are open for appeals and the deadline to file your appeal. We will also hold outreach programs with both the Cook County Assessor's office and the Board of Review.

By the time this newsletter reaches your residences, the applications for Senior and Senior Freeze exemptions should have arrived in your mailboxes. If you have not received your application, please come in and my staff will assist you. These exemptions must be applied for every year. If you have questions regarding your qualifications and what documents to bring, please call or come in. Please check your second installment tax bill to make sure you're getting the homeowners exemption. This applies only to your principle residence. This exemption will reduce your assessed value by \$10,000.

There are other exemptions available to the disabled returning veterans, disabled veterans and more. The veteran's exemptions are generally renewable in March. For additional information you will find www.cookcountyassessor.com a helpful tool.

Election Judges Serve and Earn

There never seems to be enough people interested in serving as local election judges. Election judge positions regularly go unfilled. This can result in polling place problems. Understaffed polling places often have long lines that can dissuade some residents from voting,

questions regarding ballots and voting equipment often go unanswered, and errors by both voters and harried judges can go unnoticed and uncorrected.

You can help your community by volunteering to be a judge for the upcoming April 2019 election. Also, don't forget that for your service you will be paid \$175 as an election judge or \$325 as an Equipment Judge. If you are interested in becoming a judge you can learn more and apply at the Cook County Board of Elections website <http://www.cookcountyclerk.com/election/electionjudges/Pages/default.aspx>. You can also apply through your Township Republican or Democratic organizations.

College Scholarship Money

As many High School seniors and their parents start planning (and worrying about paying) for college next fall, please keep in mind that there are many scholarship opportunities just an application away. Many students and their families fail to check these opportunities for financial support. In fact, some scholarships actually go unused.

Many local Lions Clubs and Rotary's offer scholarships to deserving students and there are numerous special scholarships available like The Community Bankers of Illinois Annual Essay Scholarship (\$1,000), The Illinois Latino Council of Higher Education Scholarships (\$1,000), and the Dollars for Scholars Student Assistance Fund Scholarships (\$2,500 Academic/\$2,500 Vocational)*. Most deadlines for the submission of applications are in early March. Talk to your High School Counselors or go online to check out these scholarship opportunities today.

News from your Highway Commissioner

As we approach the end of the 2018–2019 snow season, the Elk Grove Township Highway Department is well prepared for anything that other Nature might bring. We have a commitment to maintain Township roads and keep them free from ice and snow. Please remember to check and be sure that drainage areas and culverts are free of any debris that might reduce the drainage of melting snow near other property owners areas. This will help the flow of melting snow, and will help reduce flooding. Lastly, please do not discharge any snow from private areas onto any streets. This practice is not only inconsiderate to our neighbors and the general public, but is also illegal. In the past, Cook County Sheriff's Police have been aggressively monitoring and cracking down on such violators.

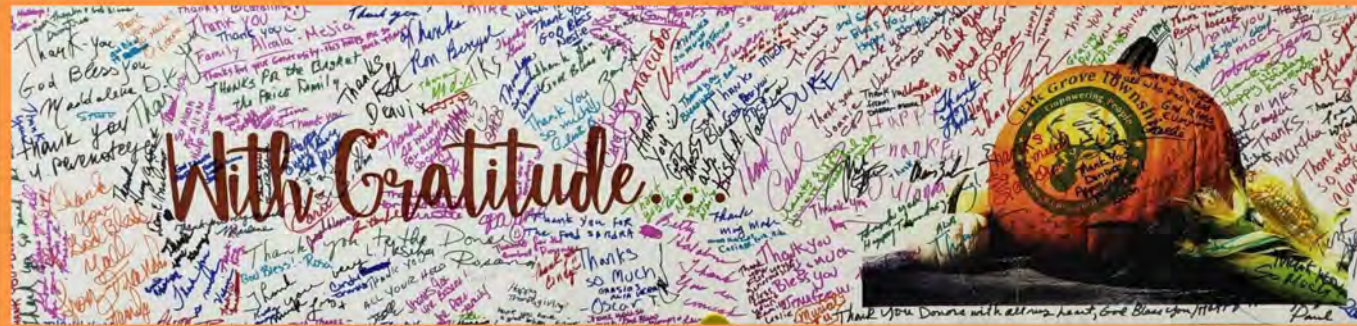

Do you worry about driving during the winter months? When the roads are icy or slick from sleet and snow, the Elk Grove Township Transportation department can offer a solution to get you to doctor appointments or the grocery store. You can use our services exclusively, or just when you need to. We offer curb-to-curb service to senior citizens (over 55) and disabled residents (over 18). Township buses can take you to your favorite local places to do your shopping and to the beauty/barber shop, pharmacy, fitness center, as well as to your doctor, dentist, optometrist or dialysis appointments. All rides within the township borders are FREE (free-will offering) and you can take one round trip ride each day Monday-Friday, as buses are available. In addition to curb-to-curb services, we also offer occasional bus trips (See schedule →, bus trips are in purple) and the TRIP program that will take residents to medical appointments outside our township boundaries. Discount taxi vouchers are also available.

GRANDPARENT: “THIS WAS SUPPOSED TO BE OUR TIME.” WHEN GRANDPARENTS TAKE IN THEIR GRANDCHILDREN

Most parents work hard, sacrifice plenty, and do whatever they can to prepare their kids to be responsible and independent adults. We want our children to be happy.

Stormwater Management

How You Can Help

(From MWRD Storm Water Management brochure for Cook County available at the Township Office)

Stormwater management does not merely apply to flood control. It can also be used to improve water quality and conserve potable water. You can help out by implementing Best Management Practices at your residence. Example BMPs include rain barrels, cisterns, green roofs, rain gardens permeable paving and natural



landscaping. One simple measure would be to disconnect your downspouts from the public storm sewer system.

The stormwater could be stored in rain barrels to be used to water gardens or directly discharged to rain gardens instead of flowing into our sewers. Reduction of stormwater flow into our sewers reduces the amount of flow discharged into our waterways and can help to alleviate flood damages from occurring due to overbank flooding.

It is illegal to dump paint, oil, or any hazardous material into a street inlet as these materials will also pollute the waterway to which the storm sewer eventually discharges. Residents living near waterways should take extra care to remove debris on their property which could wind up in the waterway.

Yard waste should be properly disposed of and not dumped into or along the banks of creeks or streams. Branches, bushes and other debris cause blockages at culverts and bridges which can cause flood damages for you and your neighbors. If you see anyone dumping garbage or any debris into a waterway, please call the MWRD at 1-800-332-DUMP.
