A Message from the Supervisor...

I hope everyone had a wonderful summer. It's been a very busy summer for us. We participated in many of the Village parades, farmer markets, and block parties. We're making every effort to get out into the community to ensure that Township residents are aware of the many services we provide. Speaking of services, we've had some exciting developments that I'd like to make you aware of.

Elk Gro

Expanded Counseling and Psychiatric Services. We have added a full-time and are currently hiring another FULL TIME Adult and Family Counseling therapist to our staff (more info on page 9). The demand for our counseling and psychiatric services increased dramatically as COVID subsided and we were beginning to build a waiting list. Since the need for these services is often immediate in nature, we want to ensure that we can provide our residents with the assistance they need in a timely manner. Our counseling and psychiatric services are no-cost and available to all residents.

Youth Services Facilities Up and Running. After a long delay, the construction of the Youth Services Bike Safety and Challenge Courses has been completed. Our Youth Services team will begin working with local elementary schools to set up Bike Safety classes starting next spring. The Challenge Course is essential to several of the programs our Youth Services team runs both onsite at the Township and local schools. These programs include Social Skills Development, Girls Empowerment, Coping/Anxiety Group, and Future Leaders. In addition to these Challenge Course related programs, our Youth Services team conducts several other in-school programs such as Bullying Prevention and Suicide Prevention. If you believe your children would benefit from participation in any of these no-cost programs and want more information, call us at 847-981-0375.

Support the Food Pantry. Our Township Food Pantry has been remarkably busy. We serve over 815 families a month, which is over double the number we were serving two years ago. Changing demographics, inflation, and changes to food stamp eligibility are driving the demand. The pantry is available to all Township residents and has a client-choice format. Thanks to all who have donated food and/or money to support the Food Pantry. Shopping reservations are required. To make a shopping appointment or to find out how to donate call us at 224-265-6111.

Assessing the Situation

For many years taxpayers could generally predict when they could file for exemptions, appeal to the Cook County Assessor's Office, and appeal to the Cook County Board of Review. The last several years has totally dispelled those assumptions. The fact that we no longer know when the second installment tax bill will be due and payable is another example of the confusion in the Cook County property tax system.

We are constantly asked when these opportunities are available. Unfortunately, we can't supply an answer. We are frequently informed hours before these events are to occur, and sometimes days after the event's start date.

It is because of this situation that we fervently encourage you to sign up for our email and phone notification system. This is easily done by calling our office and speaking to one of my staff. That number is 224-265-6110.

This year we will have been open for appeals twice with the Board of Review and once with the CCAO. To put this in perspective, we filed over 2,000 appeals with the CCAO on behalf of our taxpayers in 2022-23, and just under 800 appeals to the Board of Review with one 30-day period yet to be announced.

Obviously, our office has been busy with over 2,700 calls and 2,000 walk-ins since the beginning of the year. This is why I ask you to sign-up to receive the current information.

In addition to your assessed value appeals, we filed over 2,300 exemptions on your behalf, ensuring you get the tax relief you deserve.

The latest information we have received regarding the second installment tax bills is that the County anticipates mailing those bills in late October or early November.

If you have questions, at any time, please feel free to call or come into the office and we will do our best to get you the current information.

My staff and I wish you the blessings of the coming season.

Clerk's Corner



One of the most rewarding parts of my Clerk position is being the chairman of the Agency Grants Committee. The purpose of the committee is to process grant applications from social service agencies that help the residents in our township. As we interview them, it is exciting to hear how each organization has helped our residents in the past year, and how they continue to improve and expand their services.

Organizations that receive grant funding from the township include services for the disabled, seniors, and youth. They provide assistance with healthcare, housing, mental health services, and more. When residents come to the Social Services Department at the township seeking assistance, we not only offer services available at the township such as the Food Pantry, and General and Emergency Assistance, but our staff can also connect them with agencies that specialize in their specific area of need. It is a win-win situation that avoids duplication of services.

Each agency sends us reports during the year, documenting how many of our residents received assistance from them and which services they received, so we can keep a close account of how they are using the grant money to help our residents. As the committee hears about all the needs people have, it can be overwhelming, but learning how the employees of the different agencies are specifically trained to help with so many different needs is very encouraging.

I am grateful for our township leadership, our Board, our employees, and the many social services agencies that have a passion for helping our residents and improving their quality of life.

LIHEAP CHANGES

The LIHEAP (Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program) program year will begin on October 2, 2023, and will run until August 15, 2024. To help the most vulnerable populations within communities, there will be two (2) priority periods where only select households will be eligible to apply before the program is offered to all eligible Cook County residents.

Priority Group 1: Beginning October 2, 2023, households with a senior (60+), person(s) with a disability, and families with children under the age of 6 can apply for LIHEAP benefits. This population is also eligible to apply for furnace repair or replacement. The Furnace Assistance program will be available until May 31, 2024, or until funds are exhausted.

Priority Group 2: Beginning November 1, 2023, households disconnected from one or both utilities or in danger of being disconnected from one or both utilities can apply for LIHEAP benefits. This population is also eligible to apply for furnace repair or replacement. The Furnace Assistance program will be available until May 31, 2024, or until funds are exhausted. Note: During the month of November 2023, households with seniors, disabled individuals, and/or children under the age of 6 can also apply.

All Cook County Households: Beginning December 1, 2023, all other Cook County households may apply for benefits. Note: During the month of December 2023, through August 15, 2024, or until funds are exhausted. All Cook County residents can apply, including households with seniors, disabled individuals, children under 6 and/or disconnected/imminent disconnected households.

There will be no new PIPP or LIHWAP enrollments this program year, PY2024.

Attention-Deficit/Hyperactivity Screening for Youth

Elk Grove Township Adult and Family Counseling Program offers comprehensive ADHD Screening for youth ages 6-21. Objective tests used in the screen include the BASC-3 which evaluates social, emotional, and behavioral functioning, the TOVA (Test of Variables of Attention) visual computerized test, and the CAPS (Clinical Attention Profile Scale). A mental health professional implements these measures and interviews the child and family and gathers information from the schoolteachers. The results of the BASC-3, TOVA, CAPS, and clinical mental health interviews are compiled, and the therapist writes a report with recommendations. The counselor meets with the parents to review the findings and at that point, a copy can be sent to the school if requested. Parents may also take the findings to their pediatrician for further consultation regarding medications or other treatment options. If the child does not show signs of ADD/ADHD, the results may point to other possible explanations for the child's difficulties such as mental health, emotional, or other psychiatric problems.

Children are referred for screenings by school personnel (teachers, school social workers, school psychologists) or parents who suspect the child may have an attention-deficit/hyperactivity problem.

Passport services are by appointment only. Please call 847-437-0300 for an appointment. We have Passport Agents who speak English, Spanish, and Polish.



New Passports and Replacement Passports

Replacement passports are to replace lost or stolen passports or passports that have expired more than 5 years ago.

Items Needed for New Passports and Replacement Passports

- Proof of Citizenship birth certificate or naturalization certificate.
- Photo ID driver's license, state ID, or previous passport.
- Passport Photo recent photo, within 6 months
- Form of Payment check or money order only; the cost for a passport varies based on the urgency and age of the applicant.

Note: Minors under the age of 16 do not need an ID, but they need to have both parents present at the appointment (or provide a divorce or death certificate).

Minors aged 16 - 17 can get an adult passport, need a photo ID which can be their school ID, and need one parent present at the appointment

Young adults age 18 and up can apply for a passport on their own.
