Happy New Year!

As we start a new year, I thought it may be helpful to remind township taxpayers of my duties as Township Clerk and to highlight to key spring events.

Township Clerk Duties

- 1) Election Official for the Township
 - *Voter registration
 - *Absentee voter applications
 - *Voter assistance
 - *Election Judge supply packages
- a. *Filing nomination papers for candidates for Township office
- 2) Maintain Township records
- 3) Provide other services
 - b. *Notary public
 - c. *Hunting & Fishing Licenses
 - d. *Handicap placards
 - e. *Freedom of Information Act requests
 - f. *Cook County vehicle stickers

2017 Cook County Vehicle Stickers

For Township residents living in unincorporated areas, Cook County Vehicle Sticker notices will be sent out in early May. As a service to our residents, the Township makes the vehicle stickers available for purchase at the Township offices located at 2400 S. Arlington Heights Road, Arlington Heights. The Cook County Wheel Tax Ordinance is the law that requires the purchase of the sticker for any vehicle registered in unincorporated Cook County. Elk Grove Township does not set the price for the stickers and does not receive any compensation from Cook County for providing the service. The stickers need to be purchased and on the vehicle by July 1st or the owner can be ticketed. Also, there is a late fee for stickers purchased after the **July 1st deadline**.

The sticker price for a standard passenger vehicle is \$80 but the price goes up with the size/weight of the vehicle.

Registration of the 2017 Consolidated Election on Tuesday, April 4th

On Tuesday, April 4th eligible voters will have the opportunity to cast their ballots for a variety of important local elected positions. This election is important because these officials have a significant impact on the taxes you pay. The offices up for election on April 4th in suburban Cook County usually are:

Municipal: Mayor or President, Clerk, Treasurer, Aldermen, Council Members or Trustees.

Township: Supervisor, Clerk, Assessor, Highway Commissioner and Trustees

Special Districts: Park District Commissioners, School District Board Members, Library District Trustees, Community College Trustees, and Fire Protection District Trustees.

There are three methods you can use to register to vote on April 4th.

The last day to register to vote by paper application is March 7th and by online application is March 19th. The day after the deadline for the paper application a Grace Period begins that extends the registration deadline until March April 3rd. However, guidelines limit when and where Grace Period registrants can vote. Grace Period registrants are not eligible to vote at the polls on Election Day or take part in early voting.

1. **Online Voter Registration:** Complete the online application found on the Illinois State Board of Elections website <https://ova.elections.il.gov>. You must have a valid Illinois Driver's License or State ID to complete the application.
2. **By Mail Voter Registration:** Complete a mail-in voter registration application form and return it to the Cook County Clerk's office. Voter registration forms are available at the Township office.
3. **In Person Registration:** with a Certified Registrar: Eligible voters can register to vote in person by going to one the Cook County Clerk's designated locations (see the Cook County Clerk website at <http://www.cookcountyclerk.com>) or by meeting with your City/Village Clerk, Township Clerk or an Illinois Secretary of State driver's license facility.

Register early. Don't take a chance on missing your opportunity to have a say in who your local leaders will be for the next four years! You can verify that you are registered to vote by going to the Cook County Clerk's website (see above).

- Visa, American Express and Master Card Gift Cards for any additional needs

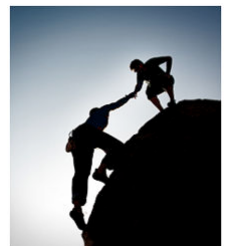
Gift Cards can be used by our residents for things like boots & uniforms, warm weather clothing, over-the-counter medical needs, etc.

News from your Highway Commissioner

Highway Department Preparing for Upcoming Winter Weather

The Elk Grove Township Highway Department is ready for the 2016 - 2017 winter season. In order to get the best possible price for road salt this year the highway department has entered in a joint purchasing agreement with Cook County. The added buying power includes not only Cook County, but also includes many other various municipalities and township highway departments and has enabled our township to acquire

bulk treated road salt at a substantial cost reduction. Also, if an unforeseen winter causes extremely high salt usage Elk Grove Township will be able to acquire any additional salt directly from any of Cook County's stockpiled inventories thereby reducing the possibility of any shortages. This will ensure our township roads will be safely treated from any winter-related road conditions which may occur.

2016 was expectedly hectic with the Triennial Reassessment and subsequent Board of Review filings. Thank you for your patience, if the lines were long, and for the numerous compliments for the work we do for you. We connected with over 8,000 taxpayers, and we hope all had a positive experience.



We have been told by the Cook County Assessor's Office that you should expect Senior renewal applications in the mail by the second or third week of January. If you need assistance or have questions, we are here for you.

For those of you that are recent homeowners, please make sure that your exemptions are in place.

You will be receiving your first installment tax bill around February 1st, due and payable by March 1st. Please be aware that your exemptions will appear on the second installment bill. The first installment is 55% of your previous yearly bill.

Stay warm and safe this winter, knowing if you need us we are here.

The Administrator's Angle

The past few months have continued to be very busy at Elk Grove Township.

There have been many generous donors along with the recipients of their donations that have passed through the Township building to deliver/receive Thanksgiving Baskets and Christmas gifts. We are very appreciative of all of the donors' efforts to provide assistance and we plan to continue "Empowering People Through Community" as our Township logo reads.

An area at the Township that we are very proud of, but many people are not aware of, is our Community Resource Board. This 30-foot wall of bulletin boards consistently contains in excess of 70 (currently 74) job openings from local employers. Other topics included on the boards are Veterans' Resources, Education Training, Seniors, Persons with Disabilities, Community Events, Health & Wellness, Food Resources and several more. The first, LIHEAP (Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program) is a one-time grant to offset the cost of higher energy costs during the colder months and is open to low income residents that pay gas and/or electric bills. The Nicor Gas Sharing Program is a partnership with the Salvation Army and can provide a one-time annual grant for residential Nicor customers. Each grant can be given to those who meet the necessary income guidelines with no requirement to be paid back.

Helping Your Child Identify Feelings Tips from the Parenting Tool Box

As children grow, we often think about the importance of their academic and social success. And, of course, we want them to be happy. But, we often neglect to think about how they are developing their “emotional competence.” This means, how well do they identify their feelings, express these feelings appropriately, understand the feelings of others, and modify their feelings or behavior based upon their interactions. You see, children with “emotional competence” are much more likely to find success both academically and socially. Really.

So, how can we help our children to develop emotional competence?

- 1) First, help them identify and label feelings. They get angry, sad, embarrassed, happy, just like we do. But, if they do not have words to talk about how they feel, they often act out their feelings in inappropriate ways. So, use these words! For example, say “You seem sad that I have to leave for work.” Or, “you were smiling, and seemed happy that you got so many birthday cards today.”
- 2) Teach your child the different ways we deal with feelings, either by asking for their ideas, or sharing your own. For example, say, “you seem frustrated with your homework, what can you do to push back against the frustration?” Or, “when I get frustrated, I take some deep breaths, and close my eyes for a few minutes.”
- 3) Praise your child when s/he tries to talk about feelings. When s/he says, “I’m really mad that you won’t let me have that cookie until after dinner,” say “thank you for sharing how you feel with me.”
(IMPORTANT: when your child is having a tantrum because they are not getting their way, it is best not to engage with them on this level).
- 4) Ask “perception of others” questions, such as, “what do you think Johnny was feeling when he was teased at school?” Or, “how can you tell when I am angry?”

In all, be a role model for identifying and expressing your feelings appropriately. Helping your children to do the same will leave them better equipped to lead successful lives.

That will surely make you feel “happy.”
