ASSESSING THE SITUATION

Most of you are aware that the first installment tax bill will be out in February, due and payable on March 1, 2024. If that is not enough to send you into a “Winter

Depression”, let’s take a look back on the second installment tax bill that you received on November 1, 2023.

Why Did My Tax Bill Go Up?

There are several reasons:

1. We were reassessed in 2022, and those increases were reflected in the second installment bill you paid in 2023.
2. One of the changes that effected most homeowners was the increase in land value. This was applied uniformly in neighborhoods so that no appeal would be granted based upon uniformity.
3. The County Assessor, Fritz Kaegi, shifted the tax burden from commercial/industrial to residential.

4. The median residential tax bill increased by 15.7%, the largest percentage tax increase in the last 30 years. Many of you saw increases far above that.
5. Schools and other taxing bodies increased their levies.
6. A new provision in the Illinois tax code, the Recapture Provision, clawed back money refunded to property owners who successfully appealed their taxes the previous year, that was another “add-on”.
7. Millions of extra dollars flowed into Tax Increment Finance districts. Little of that extra money did anything to relieve the overall burden on homeowners because nearly all of it is channeled into special funds that are not for traditional services such as police and school operations.

My thanks to Cook County Treasurer, Maria Pappas for her insightful analysis. You can find her complete analysis on our website.

WELCOME FOOD PANTRY SHOPPERS!

The Elk Grove Township Food Pantry is dedicated to aiding the members of our community in times of need and is open to all

who reside within the Township borders. To register with the food pantry, please call 224-265-6111 and schedule your first pantry visit. All that is required is a photo ID and a recent utility bill (within the last 30 days). If this is your first time visiting the Food Pantry, please be sure to arrive 15 minutes prior to your appointment to receive your Food Pantry card.



If you are a current food pantry client, be sure to check the expiration date on your food pantry card. Cards are only valid for 6 months and need to be renewed promptly. If your card is set to expire soon,

please be sure to bring a current utility bill (within the last 30 days) and photo ID to your next appointment. Food Pantry cards are extremely important as you will need to

present it every time you wish to use the Food Pantry.

Unable to physically make it to the Food Pantry?

Our pantry offers a delivery service that you can schedule! Deliveries are only made on Mondays, and you can call 224-265-6102 to set up a delivery. Please note: deliveries are restricted to the elderly and those with disabilities. Clients must call the week prior to the Monday they would like their delivery.

For over 50 years, the Youth Services Department has been committed to offering programs

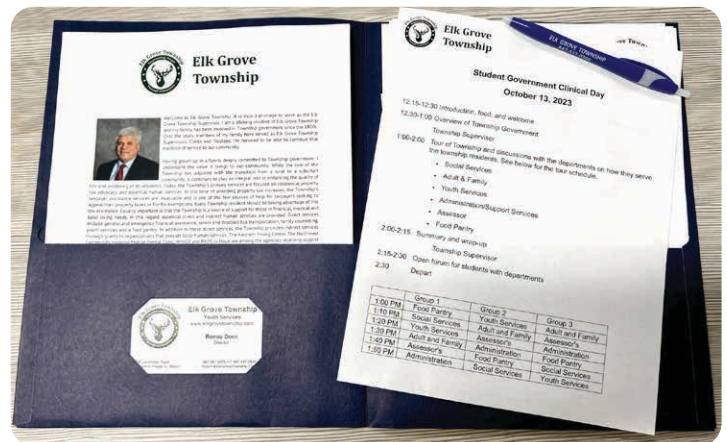
that support the emotional and mental health of children, parents, and families. This has been guided by a commitment to nurturing essential life skills in local youth. Programs like our evidence-based social skills small groups use an experiential approach to help students master competencies such as self-awareness, perspective-taking, responsible decision-making, and relationship-building. Hands-on challenges combined with reflective discussion foster growth for life's journeys.

That enduring dedication was embodied this fall through an innovative civics collaboration when Elk Grove Township Youth Services collaborated with local schools on an innovative pilot program that empowered students to engage with local governance. We partnered with Elk Grove High School to host an afternoon civic education experience for AP Government students. Students learned directly from township department leaders, getting an inside look into critical services supporting our community. From mental health resources to food assistance programs, youth gained firsthand exposure to the many ways our township aids residents across generations. Following informative tours and discussions, the students had the opportunity to have an open dialogue with our staff, asking thoughtful questions. By participating in this hands-on learning opportunity, students came away with a deeper appreciation for local government and the positive impact it provides daily to Township families.

Building on the momentum of engagement opportunities like the student government pilot, Youth Services continues facilitating impactful youth enrichment programs regularly. This includes popular social skills and girl's empowerment groups that meet weekly in the township meeting hall. Youths gain valuable strategies for self-confidence, managing emotions, positive relationship building, and more. The value of these sessions is best captured through real-life testimonials. As one parent shared, "I've noticed my daughter's interactions with others are more positive and she's a bit more confident." We're thrilled to support township youth in developing knowledge to navigate life's challenges.



For over 50 years, Elk Grove Township Youth Services has enriched lives through hands-on learning experiences that empower personal growth. From the past challenge course to today's in-demand social skills groups and SEL school partnerships, we carry on the proud tradition of empowerment through experience. GOALS AND TASKS FOR POSITIVE MENTAL HEALTH ACROSS THE AGES

Life is made up of psychological stages and tasks from infancy through old age. Erik Erikson, a well-known psychologist identified 8 stages of personality development throughout the human life span:

Infancy – establishing trust vs mistrust

Toddler – autonomy vs. shame and doubt

Preschool – initiative vs. guilt

School age – industry vs inferiority

Adolescence – identity vs identity confusion

Young adulthood – intimacy vs isolation

Middle age – generativity vs stagnation

Older adulthood – integrity vs despair

Erikson's model of developmental stages can assist families and individuals in improving mental health, considering that different family members are working towards different

life tasks at various stages. Each developmental stage builds upon the other and if goals aren't achieved, one can get stuck and exhibit challenging personality characteristics and mental health issues.

Utilizing the therapy process encourages the exploration of thoughts, emotions, beliefs, and attitudes and navigating the inner world by introspection and reflection. The process demands learning to understand family dynamics, patterns of perceiving the world, and relationships. Identifying developmental tasks and goals to be accomplished, and purposefully trying out new skills and ways of relating with the support and insight of a trained therapist or counselor can break through barriers and move forward in mental health development throughout the life span.

Elk Grove Township is proud to assist senior residents (55+) through the many services

provided. The Township's Transportation Service allows residents to be more mobile and independent as township buses can transport you to where you want to go whether that is to doctors' appointments, the grocery store, fitness center, restaurants, or one of a myriad of other places you need to visit to be self-reliant. The Township has three lift-equipped buses, including a BRAND-NEW bus, that you can register to ride and will take you to locations within the Township at no cost to you. Not sure if your favorite places to go are within township boundaries? Give us a quick call to find out. Seniors (60+) traveling outside of the township for doctors' appointments can register for the Township Riders Initiative Program (TRIP) that partners with PACE. If you need to travel outside the township border for reasons other than a doctor's appointment, consider signing up for a Taxi Discount Card. Taxi Discount Cards offer residents a five (5) dollar discount each time they ride with 303 Taxi, up to ten rides per month! 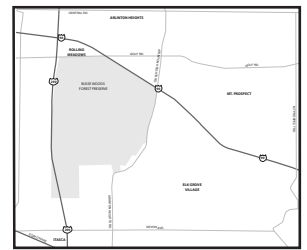

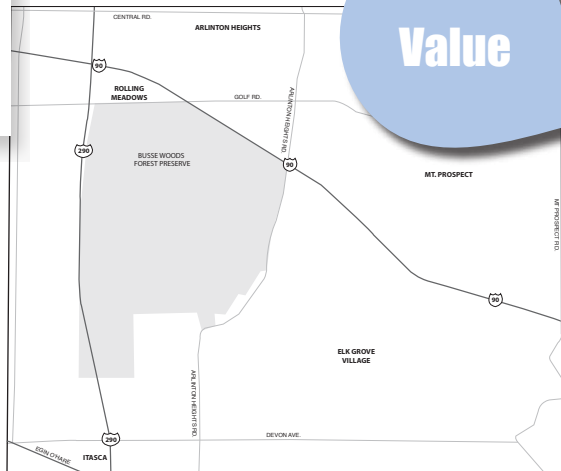

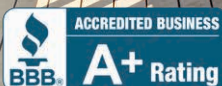
