A MESSAGE FROM TOWNSHIP SUPERVISOR GEORGE K. BUSSE

I hope you're enjoying your summer. There's a lot to enjoy – baseball, cookouts, the beach and more! While we at the Township also appreciate the sun and pleasures of a Chicago summer, we are always hard at work providing important services to you, our residents. People often ask me what they can do to help us out and I thought I'd offer a couple suggestions:

Food Pantry. Our Food Pantry always appreciates your assistance. Last month we had over 1,000 families visit the Pantry. This number is up almost threefold from just two years ago. It is unfortunate and reflects changing demographics, the loss of COVID benefits and continuing inflationary pressures. Food and monetary donations are needed. Items that the pantry is most in need of include cereal, jams and jellies, paper towels and toilet paper. Food items can be dropped off at the Pantry Monday through Friday between 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. Monetary donations can be made online on our website (elkgovetownship. com/ways-to-donate), mailed to the Township or dropped off at the Township offices. Our Address is 600 Landmeier Rd, Elk Grove Village, 60007.

Bike Safety. After a long wait due to labor and supply chain issues during COVID, the Township Bike Safety Course is in it's final stages of preparation for it's big grand opening. Classes should start late this summer. The program is in need of bikes. Many bikes did not survive the COVID shutdown and need to be replaced. New and older bikes in good shape are welcome. Bikes can be dropped off at the Township Monday through Friday between 9:00am and 4:00am

Community Empowerment Fund (CEF). CEF is an independent 501(c)(3) charity that supports the Township Social Services Department. The organization provides financial assistance when the Township sees a need but lacks the ability to help. An example is a low-income veteran whose water heater broke and he could not afford to repair it. He was without hot water for six months. With the assistance of the American Legion, CEF was able to provide the funds needed to repair the water heater and a couple other items. To donate to the Fund, send a check made out to "Community Empowerment Fund" to the Township address.

property tax cycle.

Second Installment Bills

We hope that by this time the second installment tax bill has arrived with the corresponding due date. If this is the case, and you find that your exemptions have not been properly applied, please come in to the office so that we can file a certificate of error on your behalf.

Appeals

We do not know when the Cook County Board of Review will be open for appeals. However, that makes it more important that you call my office to sign up for our notification system. You can call 224-265-6110 and request to be notified by phone and/or email as to when to file exemptions and appeals.

When you sign up it is very important that you add our contact information in your phone and/or email to prevent our messages from ending up in your spam. The email messages you will receive will be from assessor@elkgrovetownship.com.

If at any time you have a property tax question, please feel free to call. We are at your service.

Busse Woods in our township, a great place for picnics, biking, running, fishing and more. If you are going fishing in Busse Woods or anywhere in Illinois, please stop by the Township for a Illinois Fishing License. We are located at 600 Landmeier Road in Elk Grove Village, right across from the Elk Grove Village Post Office. The Township is open from 9:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m., Monday – Friday.

Here is a list of the costs of 2024 Illinois Fishing Licenses.

- Illinois Resident Daily Fee: \$5.50
- Illinois Resident Annual Fee: \$15.50
- Illinois Resident Senior (65+) /Disabled Fee: \$8.50
- Illinois Resident Super Senior (75+) Fee: \$1.50

Fishing licenses are not required for people aged 16 and under, the blind and disabled, military on active duty, and veterans who have served abroad or mobilized – just be sure to have the current appropriate ID with you. 2024 Fishing Licenses in Illinois are good until March 31, 2025.

KEEP COOL THIS SUMMER WITHOUT BREAKING THE BANK

Elk Grove Township can assist residents in applying for the Low-Income Home Energy Assistance

Program (LIHEAP). LIHEAP offers grants to help qualifying residents receive a grant towards their gas and electric bill. At time of application, your 30-day income must be at or below 200% FPL. You do not need to be past due for either utility in order to apply.


Don't wait! The program runs until August 15th, 2024, or until funds are exhausted. Act now to ensure you don't miss this valuable benefit.

To apply, simply contact Social Services at 224-265-6111 to schedule an appointment. You will need to provide your most recent electric and gas bill, proof of income for all household members in the last 30 days and Social Security Cards for all household members if available.

If you have already utilized your LIHEAP benefit for the year and finding it hard to keep up with your Nicor bill, help is available. There are many Nicor programs that can assist residents in keeping their home sourced with the gas they need. Simply contact Social Services to see if there is a program that best fits your household.

Not sure if we can assist? Just ask!

We offer various financial programs, including rent and utility assistance, a food pantry, and more. Our Social Services department is here to listen and connect you with the resources you need to overcome temporary hardships and get back on your feet.

WELCOME FOOD PANTRY SHOPPERS!

The Elk Grove Township Food Pantry has been working tirelessly to provide to families

in need within the community. Recently, we have been serving over 1,000 families and the need is still growing. Residents of Elk Grove Township are eligible to utilize the Food Pantry and all we require is a photo I.D. and a recent utility bill. Households can shop the pantry once a month and households with more than 4 members can come twice after providing documentation. Shopping is by appointment and you can call to schedule and ask further question at 224-265-6111.

Unable to physically make it to the Food Pantry? Our pantry offers a delivery service that you can schedule! Deliveries are only made on Mondays, and you can call 224-265-6102 to set up a delivery.

Please note: deliveries are restricted to elderly and those with disabilities. Clients must call the week prior to the Monday they would like their delivery.

#StampOutHunger Food Drive

The National Association of Letter Carriers hosted their annual Stamp Out Hunger Food Drive on May 11th. This initiative, recognized as the nation's largest singleday food drive, strives to strengthen communities by aiding individuals facing food insecurity. Residents were encouraged to participate by leaving a bag filled with designated non-perishable items by their mailboxes for convenient collection by letter carriers. Through the collective efforts of the community and the dedication of letter carriers, a remarkable contribution of 6,185 pounds of food was delivered to the Food Pantry!

EXPERIENCE LEARNING THAT TRANSFORMS YOUTH

At Elk Grove Township Youth Services, we immerse youth in hands-on, interactive experiences

that empower them to build essential life skills. Through our innovative experiential learning approach, students don't just hear concepts – they practice them in dynamic, engaging activities that bring the lessons to life.

Core Youth Programs

- Social Skills Group: Youth practice key social-emotional skills like conversation starters, maintaining friendships, and social awareness through collaborative games and role-playing.
- **Girls Empowerment Group:** This program guides girls to find their voice, build connections, and identify their strengths. Activities allow them to experientially learn concepts like developing an "inner coach," overcoming self-doubt, and empowering others.
- Challenge Program: We're relaunching our challenge program which is our most transformative core program.

COMMUNITY INITIATIVES

Student Government Day: High schoolers gained valuable firsthand exposure to local government operations. The day began with Township Supervisor George Busse providing an overview of the Township's functions and responsibilities. Students then rotated through different departments where department directors and staff explained their roles and duties, allowing students to ask questions and learn directly from the experts.

Initiative: This successful program provided personal care items to junior high students in need, ensuring all youth have access to basic hygiene necessities.

Social Skills Parenting

Workshop: For parents and caregivers of children in grades K-8, especially those with autism spectrum



disorder or similar social challenges, we partnered with the Elk Grove Library to offer an insightful workshop. Attendees learn practical strategies to help youth better understand social cues and improve social interactions. These sessions This signature offering develops communication, problem-solving, trust and collaboration through guided half-day, full-day or multi-day programs on our new low ropes challenge course. Groups overcome interactive physical and mental obstacles that require strategic thinking and teamwork. A facilitator training component prepares staff to create impactful experiences.

PARENTING SEMINAR RECAP: BRIDGE THE GAP

On May 16th, the Adult and Family Counseling Program hosted an enriching Parenting

Seminar titled "Bridge The Gap," developed by program therapist, Priya Vadaya Bhatt M.Sc. Health Psychology and M.A. Clinical Psychology. Carmen Martinez, M.S. in Counseling and Licensed Professional Counselor, was on hand to present the seminar in Spanish.

Vital Takeaways for Parenting:

Parenting is a challenging journey, especially in today's rapidly changing culture. Whether single or married, parents often find themselves modeling behaviors from their own upbringing, which may not always align with modern day parenting demands. The seminar provided essential insights and actionable strategies to navigate these complexities.



Key Points Discussed:

1. Understanding Emotional Triggers:

- Identification of Triggers: The seminar emphasized the importance of recognizing emotional triggers—those intense reactions to distressing or conflictual situations.

- Parent-Child Dynamics: When children do not meet expectations, parents can become triggered and react in ways that either distance the child or foster a nurturing, calm environment.

2. Self-Regulation Techniques:

- Emotional Dysregulation: Both children and parents can experience overwhelming emotional reactions. Children often struggle to manage their emotions, and parents, influenced by their own childhood experiences and current stressors, can react disproportionately to challenging behaviors like backtalk, tantrums, and messes.

- Self-Knowledge as a Tool: Understanding one's own emotional responses is crucial. Self-regulation involves mastering one's emotions and thoughts to control reactions effectively. In turn, parents can model and teach this skill to their children.

3. Practical Implementation:

- Open Discussions: The seminar provided a safe space for

parents to confidentially share their challenges and identify personal triggers.

- Skill Development: Parents learned practical skills to manage their reactions and maintain a supportive and responsive relationship with their children.

The Bridge The Gap seminar was instrumental in helping parents enhance their self-awareness and equip themselves with strategies to foster a more harmonious and emotionally intelligent family environment.

The Seminar will be held again on Saturday October 5th from 10:30 AM - 12 PM at the Township office. Childcare will be provided. To register, contact 847 981-0373 by September 27th.
