The Passing of a Community Champion. This summer we lost one of our Townships' most respected and influential leaders. Nanci Vanderweel passed away in early July after an extended illness. Nanci was a Township Trustee for 10 years and the Supervisor for 7 years. Prior to her years with the Township, she served for 20 years as an Elk Grove Village Trustee.

When she first ran for Village Trustee in 1971, she did so under the slogan "A woman, why not?" I think this slogan says a lot about Nanci. She was strong, confident and not afraid to challenge the status quo. If she felt something needed to be said or done, she never hesitated to take the lead and do it. Elk Grove Village Mayor Craig Johnson relates how Nanci once told him "Stay true to yourself, tell people what you're going to do, and do it." Yet as strong, confident and decisive as she was, I found that Nanci was always willing to listen and if you made a good argument, she was not afraid to change her position. Above all she was kind, respectful and truly cared about her community and its residents. I am grateful for the 13 years I served on the Township Board with Nanci, and she will be missed by all of us who knew her.

ASSESSING THE SITUATION

Perhaps now is the time to think about your property taxes, or past time. We are all upset when the tax bill arrives, but do you think about how that bill has gotten so high?

Look at your second installment bill. It will show you the taxing bodies that you are supporting. The largest percentage of your taxes are going to schools. Have you ever attended a school board meeting? Do you know the board members and what their agendas are? Do they truly represent your viewpoint?

We can ask these same questions of all the taxing bodies. Where are my tax dollars going? Is the money spent wisely?

I raise these questions, in this edition, because next year Elk Grove Township will be facing the triennial reassessment. Because we have been in an inflationary trend, homes will be valued higher by the Cook County Assessor, Fritz Kaegi. Your right, as a taxpayer, is to appeal to the County, the Board of Review, and the Property Tax Appeal Board. However, what you can also do is become involved. Who is representing you? What are their fiscal policies? Are they responsive to your questions?

It is said that to have a thriving democracy, you must have an informed and active citizenry. Critical thinking and researching a candidates' record and proposals become crucial. Each decision elected officials carry out is being paid for by you. When you are satisfied with a candidate, it is your duty and privilege to support that person on election day.

Most people only vote in the major elections, but think about it, local elections determine your property taxes. Get informed and use your voice.

We project that we will be open for appeals to the Cook County Board of Review sometime in October, the dates to be determined. However, that makes it more important that you call my office to sign up for our notification system. You can call 222-265-6110 and request to be notified by phone and/ or email as to when to file exemptions and appeals.

When you sign up it is very important that you add our contact information in your phone and/or email to prevent our messages from ending up in your spam. The email messages you will receive will be from assessor@elkgrovetownship.com.

As always, we are here to be your taxpayer advocate. May your upcoming holidays bring you peace and joy!

If your household income qualifies, do not miss your opportunity to apply for the Low Income Home

Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) at Elk Grove Township. Eligible households can receive a direct vendor payment based on household size to their electric and gas utility. In order to apply households need to provide the following:

- Proof of 30 day income for all household members
- Proof of social security number if applicable
- Electric and/or gas utility bill

LIHEAP will again be utilizing priority periods for applications:

Beginning October 1:

- Any household member is age 60+
- Any household member is below age 6
- Any household member receives disability income

Its primary mission is to provide comprehensive dental care to individuals who face financial barriers or lack access to traditional dental offices. By bringing dental services directly to underserved neighborhoods, the clinic aims to improve oral health outcomes and reduce disparities in dental care.

The mobile clinic offers a wide range of dental services. In order to qualify, households must be income eligible and reside within Elk Grove, Schaumburg, Palatine or Wheeling Township. If you reside within Elk Grove Township, please give us a call at 224-265-6111 to register.

WELCOME FOOD PANTRY SHOPPERS!

The Elk Grove Township Food Pantry is dedicated to supporting families in need within our

community. We are currently serving over 1,100 households a month, and the demand continues to rise. Elk Grove Township residents of can access our clients-choice Food Pantry, where they can select the items that best meet their household's needs. Our pantry offers a variety of nonperishable canned and dry goods, as well as fresh foods including dairy products, frozen meats, produce, and fruit. To use the Pantry, all residents need to provide is a photo ID and a utility bill dated within the last 30 days. Each household can visit the pantry once a month, with those having more than four members eligible for a second visit if documentation is provided. Shopping is by appointment only—please call 224-265-6111 to schedule a visit or for more information. When scheduling your appointment, please inform the pantry if you need to renew or update your food pantry card.

Unable to physically make it to the Food Pantry? Our pantry offers a delivery service that you can schedule! Deliveries are only made on Mondays, and you can call **224-265-6102** to set up a delivery.

Please note: deliveries are restricted to elderly and those with disabilities. Clients must call the week prior to the Monday they would like their delivery.

ADULT & FAMILY COUNSELING



ELK GROVE TOWNSHIP ADULT AND FAMILY COUNSELING PROGRAM OFFERS SCREENINGS FOR YOUTH

Did you know that Elk Grove Township Adult and Family

Counseling Program offers comprehensive ADHD and Mental Health Screening for youth ages 6-21?

Objective tests used in the screen include the BASC-3 which evaluates social, emotional, and behavioral functioning, the TOVA (Test of Variables of Attention) visual computerized test, and the CAPS (Clinical Attention Profile Scale). A mental health professional implements these measures and interviews the child and family and gathers information from the schoolteachers. The results of the BASC-3, TOVA, CAPS, and clinical mental health interview are compiled, and the therapist writes a report with recommendations.

The counselor meets with the parents to review the findings and at that point, a copy can be sent to the school if requested. Parents may also take the findings to their pediatrician for further consultation regarding medications or other treatment options

Children are referred for screenings by school personnel (teachers, school social workers, school psychologists) or parents who suspect the child may have an attention deficit, emotional, or behavioral challenge.

ADULT AND FAMILY COUNSELING PROGRAM ASSISTS THROUGH LIFE TRANSITIONS AND CHALLENGES FOR RESIDENTS OF ALL AGES.

Life transitions, such as returning to the classroom, parenting, schedule changes, starting or switching jobs, financial status adjustments, sending off a young adult to college, marriage, divorce, health struggles and loss can be challenging. Counseling provides support and guidance and growth during these times.

Navigating through transitions often requires developing coping strategies that are new and unfamiliar. Consulting with a trained counselor can encourage individuals to explore thoughts and beliefs about the transition leading to new perspectives and growth towards positive change. The counseling process results in increased self-awareness, personal development, and healthier choices.

A trained counselor is a trained listener who can read between the lines and bring forth in an empathic and support manner new insights to guide through life transitions.

The Elk Grove Township Adult and Family Counseling program offers services in person or virtually to all age groups. There is no charge for Township residents and psychiatric services for medication are available by contract. Evening hours are available by appointment. Jim grew up as a military child, moving frequently as his father was a career Air Force officer. In 1966, Jim enlisted in the Air Force himself, serving until 1972 and reaching the rank of Tech Sergeant. His eligibility for the VFW comes from a year-long tour in Vietnam (1968-69). While on active duty, he earned a BA from Midwestern University in Wichita Falls, TX. After separating from the Air Force, Jim pursued a law degree from IIT-Chicago Kent College of Law and practiced law for 33 years before retiring in 2015 to focus on community service.

In 2019, Jim joined Mount Prospect VFW Post 1337, where he serves as the lead writer for the Post's award-winning newsletter and was appointed Post Adjutant in 2021. He is also involved with numerous other veterans and community organizations, including AmVets Post 66, Honor Flight Chicago, and several local service clubs. Jim was married for 28 years to his wife, Kathy, and they have one daughter. His hobbies include fishing, studying military history, and supporting the Chicago White Sox.

RON VLCEK



Ron VIcek was born in Chicago in 1943 and developed an early passion for airplanes, leading him to enlist in the Air Force at age 19. From 1962 to 1966, he served as an aircraft mechanic specializing in hydraulic and pneumatic systems. After completing Basic Training at Lackland AFB and Tech School at Amarillo AFB, Ron was stationed at McChord AFB in Washington. He frequently took part in Temporary Duty assignments across various bases.

Following his military service, Ron worked for United Airlines for 37 years, starting as a Ramp Serviceman and eventually retiring in 2003 as Supervisor of Airport Operations.

About 13 years ago, Ron joined the American Legion to help fellow veterans, a role he finds deeply fulfilling. He currently serves as Adjutant for Mount Prospect American Legion Post 525. A significant part of his work is coordinating school visits during Veterans Day, where he and members of Post 525 and VFW Post 1337 engage with students to share their experiences, a tradition Ron finds especially rewarding.


