

We are delighted to welcome Dulce Viveros to our staff. Dulce brings with her fourteen years of experience in the assessment profession and is fluent in Spanish. Dulce, Laurie, Bryan and I hope

that 2025 is the best year ever for you and your families.

There are several pieces of information that you should be aware of in the coming days. 2024 tax bills will be mailed at the end of January, due and payable March 1, 2025. This bill will not reflect your exemptions. You will see your exemptions reflected on your second installment.

We have been informed by the County Assessor that exemption applications will be mailed and available the beginning of February. Senior Freeze exemptions that were applied for in 2024 will receive a renewal form in the mail. Homeowners that have homestead or senior exemptions will receive a postcard verifying that these exemptions will automatically renew. This is also true for the permanently disabled and permanently disabled veterans with 100% disability.

ELK GROVE TOWNSHIP IS HELPING TO KEEP OUR COMMUNITY WARM THIS WINTER

The winter months can bring a wave of financial challenges,

especially when it comes to heating our homes and maintaining electricity. To help residents navigate these difficulties, the Elk Grove Township Social Services Department is dedicated to providing essential support and assistance.

Energy Assistance Programs:

We understand the importance of access to affordable and reliable energy. That's why we offer assistance with the following income-based programs:

- Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP): Provides financial assistance to eligible households to help pay for heating and cooling costs.
- Furnace Program: Your household may be eligible for repair or replacement of your existing furnace if it is inoperable or red tagged.
- **Weatherization:** Income eligible households can qualify to have their home assessed for things like seals in drafty areas, insulation in attic, walls, basement and crawl spaces, and enhancing indoor air quality and ventilation.
- Low Income Discount Rate (LIDR) Program for Nicor Gas: Offers a discount on natural gas bills for incomequalified customers.
- **Nicor Energy Aide:** A customer assistance fund that provides emergency financial assistance to help eligible Nicor Gas customers pay their heating bills.
- Nicor Energy Aide and Shield of Caring: Programs that provide emergency financial assistance and a safety net for eligible Nicor Gas customers facing a heating-related crisis.

Eligibility for all these programs is determined by income. To learn more or to schedule a screening, please call us at **224-265-6111**.

Emergency Assistance:

The Emergency Assistance program provides critical support to households experiencing a temporary financial hardship. If you are struggling to pay your utility bills or facing a housing crisis, we can assist you if you meet the income guidelines and demonstrate the ability to maintain your housing and utilities moving forward.

Mobile Dental Clinic:

Endeavor Health (formerly Northwest Community Healthcare) Mobile Dental Clinic offers family dental care for residents without access to a dentist due to financial barriers in Elk Grove, Palatine, Schaumburg or Wheeling Townships. Individuals must meet income guidelines and not have private dental insurance. Financial and residency screenings must be completed by your respective township before accessing an appointment with the clinic.

WELCOME FOOD PANTRY SHOPPERS!

The Elk Grove Township Food Pantry is proud to provide assistance to residents in need

within our Township boundaries. Whether you're facing temporary challenges or longer-term difficulties, we are here to help. To register for the Food Pantry, call **224-265-6111** and schedule your initial visit. Registration requires a photo ID and a utility bill dated within the last 30 days. First-time visitors should plan to arrive 15 minutes early to complete the registration process and receive their Food Pantry card.

For current Food Pantry clients, it's important to check the expiration date on your Food Pantry card. Cards are valid for six months and must be renewed to continue accessing services. If your card is close to expiring, bring a current utility bill (dated within the last 30 days) and a photo ID to your next appointment to renew. Please remember, your Food Pantry card is required every time you visit.

If you're unable to visit the Food Pantry in person, we also offer a delivery service for your convenience. Deliveries are available on Mondays, and you can arrange one by calling **224-265-6102**. Let us continue to support you and your family with the resources you need.

Please note: deliveries are restricted to elderly and those with disabilities. Clients must call the week prior to the Monday they would like their delivery.



Our Transportation Service promotes mobility and independence by providing free rides to destinations such as medical appointments, grocery stores, fitness centers, restaurants, and more—helping you stay active and self-reliant. The Township operates four lift-equipped buses, including a brand-new one, to ensure accessibility for all riders. Curious if your favorite

MEDICARE OPEN ENROLLMENT

The Medicare Open Enrollment period has concluded successfully, thanks in part to the valuable assistance provided by our dedicated SHIP (Senior Health Insurance Program) counselor. This service is completely free and designed to help you make the best choices for your healthcare needs.

MEDICAL LENDING CLOSET

Do you know someone who has recently been injured, faced a surgery, or simply needs mobility assistance? If so, please refer them to our Medical Lending Closet. This program allows residents to borrow essential medical

equipment such as wheelchairs, commodes, canes, walkers, etc. at no cost for a period of six months. This service can
