As we are all getting over the shock of the triennial reassessment, you have a second chance to appeal your elevated assessed value by appealing to the Cook County Board of Review.

We will be holding outreach programs with the Board to facilitate the appeal process. For current information, you can go to **www.elkgrovetownship.com**. For those of you that are on our email and phone notification program, we will let you know as soon as we get that information.

Remember, second installment tax bills will be coming, due and payable August 1st, if they are mailed on time. When you receive that bill, please check to see that the exemptions you are entitled to have been applied. If they have not, we will assist you in getting them reinstated.

Some residents may notice changes this year stemming from referenda approved in November 2024, particularly those related to District #57 and the Mt. Prospect Park District. They serve as a reminder of the important role that community participation and informed voting play in shaping our local services and priorities.

Periodically, we add information to our website from the County Assessor's office, the Treasurer's Office, and the Board of Review. These articles give you additional insight to the Cook County property tax system. Always know that if you have questions, we will do our best to get you the correct information.

I wish to extend our sincere appreciation for your patience and understanding during the triennial reassessment. My staff and I realize how stressful this process can be. It is our mission to be your advocate within the limits of our statutory responsibilities.

DON'T LET GAS BILLS PILE UP: NICOR ASSISTANCE AND TOWNSHIP SUPPORT ARE HERE!

As we move through the year, keeping up with household

expenses, especially utility bills, can sometimes be a challenge. If you're a Nicor Gas customer experiencing financial hardship, know that there are programs available to help, and Elk Grove Township is ready to assist you in applying.

Nicor Gas offers several valuable assistance programs designed to provide relief to eligible residents. These programs can make a significant difference in managing your gas bill and maintaining essential services.

Here are some of the key Nicor Gas assistance programs you should know about:

• **Shield of Caring:** This program helps residential customers with past-due Nicor Gas bills due to financial hardship (like job loss, illness, or disability). Eligible customers can receive a grant of up to \$250 towards their past-due balance. Eligibility generally applies to

households with income less than 400% of the Federal Poverty Level.

- Nicor Gas Sharing Program: Funded by Nicor Gas employees and customers, this program offers one-time annual grants to income-eligible customers, including seniors and veterans. This program provides direct financial relief. Eligibility typically applies to households with income between 201% and 300% of the Federal Poverty Level. Households must not have received LIHEAP (Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program) in the current year.
- Nicor Energy Aide Program: This program provides grants to qualifying households to help with natural gas bills, especially those with past-due balances.
 Customers with non-heat accounts can also be eligible.
 Eligibility generally applies to households with income at or below 350% of the Federal Poverty Level.

WELCOME FOOD PANTRY SHOPPERS!

The Elk Grove Township Food Pantry is currently serving 1,100 families a month, a number that continues to grow as the cost of living rises. In just two years,

demand has nearly tripled. We encourage Elk Grove Township residents to schedule appointments for their monthly usage to meet their household needs. Operating as a 'Client's Choice' model, the Food Pantry allows families to shop and choose what items best suit their family. Shopping the pantry does require an appointment and can be made by calling 224-265-6111.

Unable to physically make it to the Food Pantry? Our pantry offers a delivery service that you can schedule! Deliveries are only made on Mondays, and you can call **224-265-6102** to set up a delivery.

Please note: deliveries are restricted to elderly and those with disabilities. Clients must call the week prior to the Monday they would like their delivery.

EXPANDING FOOD ACCESS: NEW PANTRY LOCKERS SERVE MORE RESIDENTS

I'm thrilled to share that the forward-thinking vision of Supervisor Busse and the previous Board has come to life with the addition of brand-new refrigerated food pantry lockers—a vital expansion of the Township's growing food assistance program.

Unveiled on May 17, these state-of-the-art lockers are designed to serve working individuals and others who struggle to access the Food Pantry during regular business hours. Dedicated in honor of former Township Supervisor George K. Busse, they reflect our enduring commitment to reaching as many residents as possible. By allowing pickups after hours and on weekends, they remove barriers for those facing transportation challenges or conflicting work schedules. This innovative system is expected to serve 2,000 more individuals annually, offering much-needed flexibility. Access to food is a basic need, and no one should have to choose between feeding their family and keeping their job. These lockers help close that gap, ensuring we can support even more residents who rely on this essential service.

Dedicating the food pantry lockers in Busse's name is a meaningful tribute to his years of devoted service to the Township and his leadership as Supervisor. His dedication to expanding resources profoundly impacted our residents, strengthening adult and family counseling, senior services, and youth programs—all in pursuit of continuous improvement.

SUPPORTING MENTAL HEALTH IN OUR COMMUNITY

Elk Grove Township is proud to offer comprehensive counseling services to residents of all ages. Our team of licensed counselors and family therapists provides compassionate, client-centered care tailored to each individual's needs, with a strong focus on families.

Services are currently available in English, Spanish, Hindi, and Gujarati, ensuring accessible support for our diverse community.

Our counseling department offers:

- Individual, Couples, and Family Counseling
- In-person and Teletherapy Sessions
- Psychiatric and Medical Case Management
- ADHD Screenings
- Substance Abuse Counseling
- Parenting Seminars (offered in English and Spanish)

With three full-time and two part-time professionals on staff, we continue to meet the growing mental health needs of our residents.

Our commitment to mental wellness is stronger than ever, and we remain dedicated to supporting the health and well-being of our community.

In 2023, we provided **1,623 therapy** sessions, serving **1,010 individuals**.

In response to increasing demand, 2024 has seen a significant expansion—with **2,072 sessions** delivered to **1,149 township** residents to date.

- **Seniors:** Must be age 65 or older.
- Individuals with a Permanent Disability: Must be age 16 or older and have a permanent disability.

Income Criteria (based on 2024 income):

• **Single Person:** Total household income of \$33,562 or less

• Couple: Total household income of \$44,533 or less

To ensure a smooth application process, please remember to bring the following to your appointment:

- Your 2024 income tax return
- All 1099 forms from 2024 (e.g., Social Security 1099, pension 1099s, interest/dividend 1099s)


