Our dedicated staff have worked tirelessly this year to identify new ways to serve our most vulnerable residents through innovations and efficiencies. Yet, as our community's needs evolve,

there are moments when expanding our resources become essential. One area where this has become increasingly clear is Adult & Family Counseling. Over the years, the Township has seen a significant and growing demand for these services, highlighting the importance of accessible, compassionate support for individuals and families navigating life's challenges.

Recently, the Township Board approved a key recommendation to elevate one of our part-time therapists to full-time status. This strategic move enables us to expand evening availability, and enhance our counseling services by retaining a highly skilled professional. With this addition, the Adult & Family Counseling Department now comprises a robust team of five: two Licensed Clinical Social Workers, one Licensed Clinical Professional Counselor, one Licensed Professional Counselor, and one Licensed Social Worker. Together, they offer a wide spectrum of expertise in social work, counseling, psychology, addiction recovery, and parent education. This dynamic blend of advanced credentials and multilingual capabilities places Elk Grove Township at the forefront of accessible, high-quality mental health care. It's a testament to our commitment to meeting residents where they are with compassion, professionalism, and a deep understanding of the challenges families face today. It's worth emphasizing that this enhancement was achieved within the existing budget and received unanimous approval from the Township Board, reflecting both sound fiscal responsibility and shared commitment to mental health and wellness.

ASSESSING THE SITUATION

Many of you have reached out to ask when your property tax bills will arrive, as of this writing, I was told that they would be sent in "late fall or early winter". I know this is very distressing, and I wish I had

adequate answers for you. Excuses are not acceptable when you are trying to budget for your home.

In the coming editions of our township newsletter, I will attempt to answer the other most asked question, "Why are my taxes so high?"

For those taxpayers that live in School District #57 and the Mount Prospect Park District, you will see a substantial increase due to the referenda passed last fall. Elections have consequences.

As to other factors, the first reason is obvious. Taxing bodies are levying to the maximum, right up to their tax caps.

The second reason is that "home rule" taxing bodies have no caps to what they can levy.

Third, and mostly under reported is the Illinois 2021 Recapture Law (Section 18-233).

Example: If The Cook County Assessor issued refunds within the past 12 months, due to Property Tax Appeal Board Decisions, court orders, or certificates of error, those refunds do not come from the monies given to the taxing bodies. They are automatically added to next year's tax levy by the Cook County Clerk, effective with the 2021 levy onward. This "prior year adjustment" does not count against the Property Tax Extension Limitation Tax caps.

The result of this law, in simple terms, is that our taxpayers are paying for the mistakes of the Cook County Assessor. The taxing bodies love it because it is a windfall to them, but an onerous burden on the taxpayer.

This is just one factor behind the state's high property taxes, which has influenced some residents to weigh their options about remaining in Illinois. I will address additional reasons in the coming editions.

I want to inform you of the passport services that the township offers as a Passport Acceptance Facility. **We now offer passport photos for \$10 a**

person. This can save you a stop and you can complete all the steps to apply for your passport at the township.

Passport services are available M – F, 9:00am – 3:00pm. We take walk-ins but appointments are recommended. Please call **847-437-0300** for an appointment. We have Passport Agents who speak, English, Spanish, or Polish.

New Passports and Replacement Passports

- Replacement passports are to replace lost or stolen passports.
- Adult passports that expired more than 5 years ago.
- Expired Minor 5-year Passports

Items Needed for New Passports and Replacement Passports

- Proof of Citizenship – birth certificate or naturalization certificate or prior US Passport (may be expired)
- Photo ID – driver's license or state ID w/additional identification
- Passport Photo – recent photo within last 6 months

- Passport Forms – prefilled for appointment
- Form of Payment – check or money order only for U.S. Department of State fees. Additional fees may apply.

Note: Minors under the age of 16 do not need an ID, but they need to have both parents present at the appointment (or provide a divorce or death certificate or consent form DS 3053).

Minors aged 16-17 can get an adult passport, need a photo ID which can be their school ID, and need one parent present at the appointment. Young adults aged 18 and up can apply for an adult passport on their own.

ADULT Passport Renewals

If your passport expires within 5 years of the issue date, you can apply for renewal. **NOTE:** you do not need to come into the township office for a renewal. You must mail the renewal form directly to the U.S. Department of State. However, you can get renewal forms, a passport photo taken at the township, and instructions on mailing the application even if you are just doing a renewal.

If you are planning a trip where you need a passport, please plan far in advance in getting your application completed. Depending on the time of year, passports can take a lot more time to be received than at other times. Current processing time for standard service is 4-6 weeks plus mailing time, 2-3 weeks with expedited services offered for an additional \$60.

The Social Services Department's mission is to support the financial health and well-being of every resident who needs assistance. We understand that each household's situation is unique, which is why our approach is both comprehensive and compassionate.

Our team begins by screening residents for eligibility in programs offered directly through the Township. These programs include emergency financial assistance, transportation services, and access to food and other basic needs. We know that financial challenges often extend beyond immediate needs, which is why we take a holistic approach—connecting residents to a network of partner



organizations and community resources. These partnerships enable us to provide support for housing stability, healthcare, energy assistance, employment services, and more.

Financial stress can impact every aspect of life, but no one should have to face these challenges alone. By working together, we can create solutions that strengthen the overall financial health of our community.

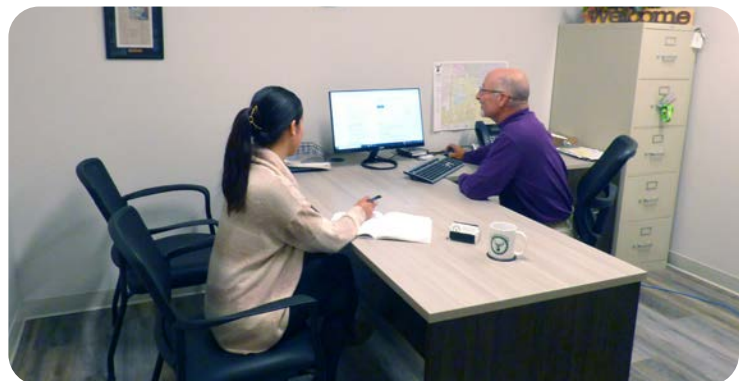

The Elk Grove Township Food Pantry is now serving more than 1,100 families each month, a number that has nearly

tripled the last few years. This growing demand is met thanks to the generosity of our community, especially the local gardeners who provide a steady supply of fresh, homegrown produce. Their contributions alone added up to more than 2,000 pounds of fresh produce this season, helping ensure families have access to healthy, nutritious options.

Every donation, from canned goods to garden harvests, helps strengthen our community and keep shelves stocked for neighbors in need.

The Pantry operates on a "Client's Choice" model, allowing families to shop for the items that best meet their household needs. Appointments are required and can be scheduled by calling [224-265-6111](tel:224-265-6111).

ADULT & FAMILY COUNSELING

GUIDANCE THROUGH TRANSITIONS, CHALLENGES, AND NEW BEGINNINGS

The fall season is notable for a time of transitions and change. With the start of the school

year, changing family schedules, and anticipated shifts in the weather and daylight hours, the season can bring anticipation for new beginnings along with having to adjust to endings.

Some of us respond to transition and change smoothly and quickly most times, though there may be a season in life which the transition is rocky or even debilitating. Starting a new school, job, or relationship is exciting and uplifting, but can also come with new challenges and unanticipated stress. Adjusting from endings can be looked at as opportunities for growth or can stir up fear and anxiety.

All of us, at some point in life, will be faced with difficult changes and transitions for ourselves and family members. It may be divorce, job loss, financial setbacks, discrimination, school problems, retirement, health challenges, care giving, coping with illness and death. The psychological coping mechanisms we use to respond to these changes can either propel us into a hopeful future or keep us stuck.

Everyone manages change and transitions at a different pace and with varying degrees of success. If you get stuck, don't be too hard on yourself. If you continue to struggle you may need to seek additional assistance such as information, support, personal coaching, or counseling.

The Adult and Family Counseling Program offers confidential Counseling services and can help Elk Grove Township residents navigate overcoming barriers to change and guide transitions. To speak with a licensed counselor for more information, contact **847 981-0373**.

MEDICARE ASSISTANCE THROUGH ELK GROVE TOWNSHIP'S CERTIFIED SHIP COUNSELOR

Navigating Medicare can feel overwhelming, but Elk Grove

Township is here to help. We are proud to have a certified SHIP (Senior Health Insurance Program) counselor on staff to provide residents with free, unbiased guidance on all aspects of Medicare.

Our SHIP counselor is trained and certified by the State of Illinois to assist residents in understanding Medicare options, enrollment periods, supplemental plans, prescription drug coverage, and programs that may lower out-of-pocket costs. This service ensures that you have the information needed to make confident, informed decisions about your healthcare coverage.

Who Is Eligible for SHIP Assistance?

SHIP counseling is available to:

- Anyone currently enrolled in Medicare (Parts A and B)
- Those approaching Medicare eligibility (generally age 65 or qualifying due to disability)

There is no cost for this service, and SHIP counselors do not sell insurance. They provide unbiased, accurate information tailored to your needs.

Appointments with our SHIP counselor are available by scheduling through the Elk Grove Township Social Services Department [224-265-6111](tel:224-265-6111).

Call us today to schedule your free appointment and take the guesswork out of Medicare.

Important Enrollment Dates

- Medicare Annual Open Enrollment: October 15 – December 7 each year. During this period, you can:
- Change from Original Medicare to a Medicare Advantage Plan (or vice versa)
- Switch or drop prescription drug plans (Part D)
- Make other coverage adjustments for the upcoming year

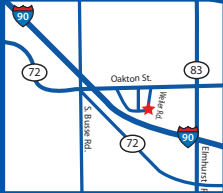

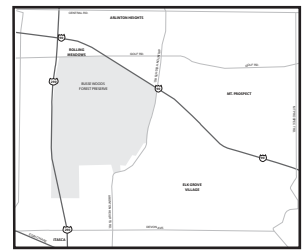

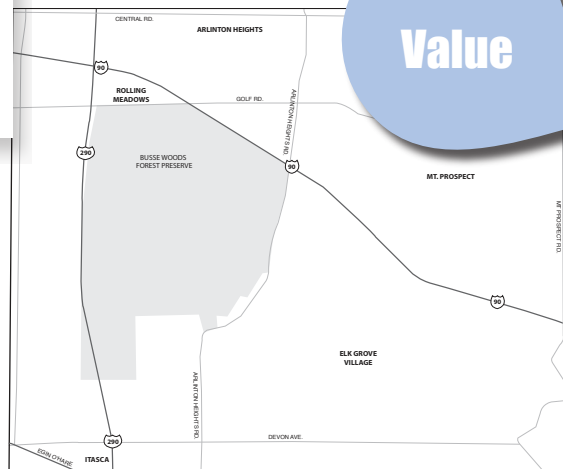
