ASSESSING THE SITUATION

2025 stands out as one on the most chaotic and disappointing tax years in my memory. Many, if not most, of our taxpayers saw rising property taxes, dropped exemptions, unprocessed (by the County) certificates of error that generated incorrect tax bills, and increased escrow payments to mortgage lenders. In addition, **the reassessment of Elk Grove Township will be reflected on your second installment tax bill this year.**

Many of you have asked me, "what can be done?" I am asking you to look at your 2024 Second installment Property Tax Bill that you received in November, 2025. This is the time to analyze the information that Cook County Treasurer; Maria Pappas has so helpfully provided on that bill.

Under the bold type heading it shows where your money goes from tax year 2023 to 2024, keeping in mind that we pay property taxes in arrears.

When reviewing your tax bill, it can be helpful to look at which taxing bodies have increased their levies. In some

cases, changes may stem from a voter-approved referendum or long-term financial planning decisions. Residents are encouraged to stay informed by reviewing public budgets, attending local meetings when possible, and learning more about how these entities plan for future expenses. Taking an active interest in these processes can provide valuable insight into how local decisions impact household costs

Next, look to see, under the Tax Calculator box, if you received the exemptions that you qualified and applied for. There are substantial savings to be had. Check our website for these exemptions, and the qualifications to apply.

Additional information can be found on the back of your bill, showing the Taxing Districts Breakdown.

My thanks to Treasurer Pappas for providing this valuable information, and her dedication to keeping taxpayers informed.

You will have two opportunities to appeal your assessed value this year, once with the Cook County Assessor and once with the Cook County Board of Review. If successful, great! If not, you have nothing to lose, they will not raise the current value.

I strongly advise that you call our office at **224-265-6110** and sign up for email or phone notifications so that you're up-to-date on the yearly assessment process. It is your money!

LIHEAP AND UTILITY ASSISTANCE CHANGES FOR THE 2026 PROGRAM YEAR

Elk Grove Township would like to remind residents that all income-eligible households may apply for the Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) to receive help with their ComEd and Nicor Gas bills. Applications are open to anyone who has not already applied since October 1, 2025. If you have not applied for this program year, we encourage you to schedule an appointment with our Social Services team by calling **224-265-6111**.

Many residents may have noticed recent changes to LIHEAP benefit amounts. This year's benefits are lower than past years due to federal funding changes, but support is still available to help households manage their utility costs.

Households approved for LIHEAP will continue to receive the Nicor Gas LIDR (Low-Income Discount Rate) directly

on their monthly bill. This discount ranges from 5% to 83%, depending on household income. Beginning January 2026, a similar income-based discount will also be available for ComEd customers, offering additional support to eligible residents.

We also encourage everyone to review the updated income guidelines, as they have changed from previous years and may affect eligibility. **Even if you were not eligible in the past, you may qualify under the new limits.**

For questions or to schedule a LIHEAP appointment, please contact Elk Grove Township Social Services. Our team is here to help ensure that every qualifying household receives the assistance they need this winter.

NEED HELP WITH YOUR NICOR GAS BILL? WE CAN HELP YOU APPLY FOR ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

Elk Grove Township Social Services is here to support residents who may be struggling with their natural gas bills. In addition to LIHEAP, our office can assist you in applying for several Nicor Gas assistance programs. Each program has different eligibility requirements and provides valuable support for households facing financial hardship.

Nicor Sharing Program:

Household income must fall within program guidelines (often slightly ABOVE LIHEAP limits). Customers can only apply once per year and can receive a benefit between \$150-\$400 based on their past due balance.

Nicor Energy Aide Program:

Customers can apply only once per year and must fall at or below 350% of the federal poverty level in the last 30 days from enrolling in the program. Customers can receive a benefit of up to \$250 based on their past due balance.

Shield of Caring Program:

The Shield of Caring Program, supported by Nicor and community partners, assists households facing challenges that threaten their basic needs, including utility costs. Customers may apply only once per year and must fall at or below 400% of the federal poverty level in the last 30 days from enrolling in the program

If you think you may qualify, or if you're unsure, please contact Elk Grove Township Social Services. Our team will walk you through the application process, review eligibility for all available programs, and help ensure you access the support that best meets your needs. For each of these programs a most recent Nicor bill in a household members name must be submitted, all income for all household members in the last 30 days and a photo ID.

FOOD PANTRY

WELCOME FOOD PANTRY SHOPPERS!

Elk Grove Township's Food Pantry continues to support residents facing both short-term and ongoing food challenges. Township residents in need are encouraged to register by calling **224-265-6111** to schedule an initial visit. Registration requires a photo ID and a utility bill dated within the last 30 days. First-time visitors should plan to arrive about 15 minutes early to complete paperwork and receive a Food Pantry card.

Food Pantry cards are valid for six months. Current clients are reminded to check their expiration date and bring a photo ID and a current utility bill to their appointment if renewal is needed. A valid Food Pantry card is required at every visit.

For residents who are unable to visit during regular hours, the Township also offers refrigerated food pantry lockers, providing a convenient option for evening or weekend pickup. Registered clients may call **224-265-6111** to place an order and arrange a locker pickup time. This option is especially helpful for working families or those with transportation challenges.

- **Bike Safety Program** – This program provides youth with essential knowledge about safe riding practices, rules of the road, and responsible decision-making to help them stay safe and confident in the community.

NEW YEAR'S RESOLUTIONS: HELPFUL MOTIVATION OR ADDED PRESSURE?

Veterans Honor Roll

The Veterans Honor Roll acknowledges residents for their distinguished service in the armed forces. Inductees were presented with an honor roll plaque at the November Township Board meeting on November 24.



Thomas Benson

Thomas Benson enlisted in the U.S. Air Force in 1966 and served during the Vietnam War, including deployment to Guam with the Strategic Air Command's 306th Bomb Wing supporting B-52 missions. He later trained as an electric power line specialist and completed his final tour at Shemya AFB in Alaska during the Cold War. He has been an active member of the Edison Park American Legion Post 541 for 54 years and continues to serve as its finance officer.



Brian Gilligan

Captain Brian Gilligan served 30 years in the U.S. Navy Reserve as an Intelligence Officer, advancing to senior leadership roles including Commanding Officer and Executive Officer of intelligence units. He supported U.S. and coalition operations worldwide, including a 2013 deployment to Kabul, Afghanistan, where he served with the International Security Assistance Force. His distinguished career was recognized with multiple honors, including the Meritorious Service Medal and Defense Meritorious Service Medal.



Dennis Hickey

Dennis Hickey was drafted into the U.S. Army in 1969 and served as an Infantryman with the 25th Infantry Division in Vietnam. His service was recognized with numerous honors, including the Bronze Star Medal, Air Medal, and Combat Infantryman's Badge. After returning home, he earned a degree from Benedictine University while working full-time and later retired after 25 years as a Supply Chain Manager. He has lived in Elk Grove Township since 1987.



Raymond Holich

Raymond Holich served in the U.S. Coast Guard from 1969 to 1973, specializing in electronics maintenance. He graduated first in his class from Electronics School and maintained critical communication and navigation systems on cutters and small boats in Texas. He attained the rank of ET2 (E-5) and was among the senior personnel at his station. After his service, he began a civilian career repairing instrumentation for Hewlett-Packard.

NEED HELP APPLYING FOR THE ILLINOIS BENEFIT ACCESS PROGRAM? WE'RE HERE FOR YOU!

Need Help Applying for the Illinois Benefit Access Program? We're Here for You!

Elk Grove Township would like to remind our senior residents that our Social Services Department can assist you in applying for the Illinois Benefit Access Program (formerly known as the Circuit Breaker Program). This state program provides valuable benefits to eligible older adults which includes:

- Discounted license plate renewal fees
- The Seniors Ride Free or Reduced Fare Transit Benefit (depending on eligibility)

Who Is Eligible?

To qualify for the Illinois Benefit Access Program, applicants must meet the following criteria:

- Age:
 - 65 or older
 - 16 to 64 with a disability and receiving Social Security Disability benefits
- Residency:
 - Must be an Illinois resident at the time of application
- Income:
 - Household income must fall within the state's current income limits. These limits are adjusted periodically,

so we encourage residents to check with us for the most recent guidelines. As of publication the income threshold for a household of 1 is \$33,562

What You Need to Apply:

- A valid state-issued ID
- Your Social Security number
- Your spouse's information (if married), including SSN and date of birth
- Annual household income information, including:
 - Social Security statements
 - Pension income
 - Employment income (if applicable)
 - Any other income received within the last calendar year

We're Ready to Help! If you believe you may qualify, or simply want to check, please contact Elk Grove Township Social Services to schedule an appointment. We are happy to assist you in accessing the benefits you deserve.

ATTENTION SENIORS: MEDICARE PLAN CHANGES AND SHIP COUNSELING

Elk Grove Township would like to remind our senior residents that you can still meet with a SHIP (Senior Health Insurance Program) counselor if you have qualifying factors that allow you to make changes to your Medicare coverage. SHIP counselors provide free, unbiased guidance to help you review your options and make informed decisions about your healthcare coverage.

Who Can Change Their Medicare Plans Now?

Even outside the standard Medicare Annual Enrollment Period (October 15 – December 7), you may qualify for a Special Enrollment Period (SEP) if you experience certain life events, such as:

- Moving to a new area
- Losing other health coverage
- Changes in your income affecting Medicaid or Extra Help eligibility
- Other qualifying circumstances as defined by Medicare

If you meet these criteria, a SHIP counselor can help you explore plan options, compare costs, and determine which plan best meets your needs.

For those currently enrolled in Medicare Advantage (MA) Plans, you have until March 31, 2026, during the Medicare Advantage Open Enrollment Period, to make the following changes:

- Switch from one Medicare Advantage plan to another
- Drop your Medicare Advantage plan and return to Original Medicare
- Join a Medicare Prescription Drug Plan (Part D) if returning to Original Medicare

This period is an important opportunity to ensure your plan still fits your healthcare needs for the year.

Our trained SHIP counselor can review your current coverage and benefits, assist with plan comparisons and enrollment forms, and explain your options and costs. Contact Elk Grove Township Social Services at **224-265-6111** to schedule a SHIP counseling session and make sure your Medicare coverage meets your needs for 2026. Don't miss your opportunity to make changes during the open enrollment and Medicare Advantage periods!


