A MESSAGE FROM TOWNSHIP SUPERVISOR JOHN SCALETTA

As spring takes hold, our community is reminded how quickly new energy can take root. This season of renewal is an ideal moment to share the progress, partnerships, and opportunities emerging across our township. Since my last message, the Township Board has embarked on a strategic planning process to help guide our future direction and initiatives. This effort has been both thoughtful and rewarding, and I am grateful to the many

residents who attended our planning meeting to share their insights and concerns. While our longterm roadmap is still being finalized, it is important to know that the Board and staff are working collaboratively to strengthen our township through intentional planning and clear communication. I look forward to sharing the Board's goals and initiatives later this spring once the process is complete.

At our February Board meeting, we also discussed and approved the tentative FY26–27 budget. I am pleased to report that the Board passed a balanced budget that maintains all Township programs and services our residents rely on for a strong quality of life. The budget includes \$640,000 in funding for local partner agencies that provide direct support to our community. These funding recommendations were developed by our Mental Health and Wellness Committee, which spent several months reviewing grant applications, interviewing agency representatives, and evaluating community needs. The Committee approached this work with diligence and care, balancing service needs with our commitment to fiscal responsibility

Finally, the Elk Grove Township Community Empowerment Fund (CEF) is seeking donors. The CEF, a 501(c)(3) organization, works in partnership with the Township to advance our mission of "Empowering People Through Community". While our programs are designed to be efficient and comprehensive, there are times when certain limitations prevent us from fully addressing a resident's emergency. The CEF helps fill those gaps by supporting residents who are working toward self-sufficiency. By scanning the QR code (on the back cover of this newsletter), you can contribute directly to the Community Empowerment Fund and make a difference in the life of someone pursuing independence and self-reliance.

and looking forward to outdoor activities this spring and summer.

If you are planning on going fishing or hunting in Illinois this year you can purchase your licenses at Elk Grove Township. The Township is located at 600 Landmeier Road in Elk Grove Village directly across from the US Post Office, and is open from 9 AM – 4 PM, Monday through Friday.

2026 Illinois Fishing License Fees:

- Illinois Resident Daily (24 hour) Fee: \$5.50
- Illinois Resident Annual Fee: \$15.00
- Illinois Resident Senior (65+) Fee: \$7.75
- Illinois Resident Super Senior (75+) Fee: \$1.50

Fishing licenses are NOT required for anyone age 16 or under, military on active duty, veterans who have served abroad or mobilized, the blind and disabled. Please be sure to carry a current appropriate ID.

Please note: 2026 Fishing Licenses start on March 1, 2026, and expire on March 31, 2027.

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE THROUGH ELK GROVE TOWNSHIP: A SAFETY NET IN TIMES OF CRISIS

Unexpected hardships can happen to anyone. A medical issue, job disruption, or sudden loss of income can quickly put a household at risk. That's why Elk Grove Township offers an Emergency Assistance Program designed to help residents stabilize during a true crisis.

This program is intended for residents facing a life-threatening emergency, such as a utility shut-off, eviction, or other situation that could result in the loss of safe housing or essential services. Assistance is available when the emergency can be resolved with financial support and when the household is positioned to remain stable moving forward.

All residents must complete a determination interview along with application. During this process, Township staff will review your current situation, income, household circumstances, and supporting documentation. There are established maximum income guidelines, and applicants must demonstrate that:

- They are experiencing a qualifying emergency (such as eviction or utility disconnection).

- The emergency was caused by a temporary hardship or fluctuation in income.
- The situation can be resolved with assistance.
- They will be able to sustain their household expenses after the crisis has been addressed.

Residents seeking assistance should contact the Township to begin the screening process and receive a detailed list of required documentation. Documents typically include proof of income, identification, lease or mortgage statements, utility bills, and any notices related to the emergency. Staff will clearly outline what is needed so applicants can gather the appropriate paperwork.

Our goal is to provide short-term support that leads to long-term stability. If you or someone you know is facing a qualifying emergency, please reach out to Elk Grove Township at **224-265-6111**. We are here to help residents navigate difficult times and work toward a stable path forward.

FOOD PANTRY

NOW OPEN THURSDAY EVENINGS!

In response to the growing needs of our community, Elk Grove Township is proud to announce

that our Food Pantry has AGAIN expanded its hours. We are now open on Thursday evenings! This expansion allows us to better serve working families and individuals who may not be able to visit during traditional daytime hours.

The Township Food Pantry is currently serving over 1,000 families every single month, and we remain committed to ensuring that no resident goes without access to nutritious food. Our clients-choice pantry allows families to “shop” for the items that best meet their household’s needs, offering dignity, flexibility, and healthier outcomes.

To schedule an appointment to shop the pantry, please call **224-265-6111**. If you are unable to schedule an appointment in advance, you may stop in to pick up a pre-packed option. Please note that registration is required for both shopping appointments and pre-packed distributions.

In addition to in-person shopping, the Food Pantry offers curbside delivery for seniors and residents with disabilities who are physically unable to come into the pantry. This service is available to Township residents only and requires registration with a current bill and I.D. To learn more about curbside delivery, please call **224-265-6111** and ask for Kailee.

For residents who find it difficult to visit during normal operating hours, we have also installed refrigerated lockers that are accessible 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. These lockers provide flexible, secure access to food outside of standard pantry hours. For more information about the locker program, please call **224-222-0944**.

Give your child the confidence to ride safely! Elk Grove Township's Bike Safety program, designed for K-5th graders, supports physical activity, builds confidence, and reinforces important safety skills in a fun, responsible way! Fees waived for Elk Grove Township residents.

Bicycles and helmets are encouraged, but will be available for on-site use in limited sizes.

Did you know that in addition to offering counseling and direct social services, Elk Grove Township awards grants to local organizations providing mental health and wellness services to township residents? The Mental Health and Wellness Committee of Elk Grove Township provides financial support to local nonprofits used by the township to supplement township services. The committee members included township board trustee Rob Lugiari, Corey Dewey (Social Service Director), Luanne Pross (Clinical Director), and community members Richard Keenley, Steve Grzeszczak, and Eileen Valentino.

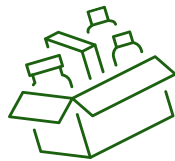

SENIOR SERVICES

DEDICATED SUPPORT FOR OLDER ADULTS

Elk Grove Township has a staff member available to answer questions and provide assistance dedicated specifically to seniors. Call to schedule an appointment to review the Benefit Access Program, receive assistance with Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) applications, apply for the Mobile Dental Clinic, or learn more about any of our other Senior Social Services and programs.

We understand that navigating benefits and government programs can sometimes feel overwhelming. Our Older Adult Benefits Specialist provides one-on-one support to help seniors understand eligibility requirements, gather necessary documentation, and complete applications accurately and confidently.

Seniors are also reminded that while there are new guidelines regarding maintaining SNAP benefits, there

are important exemptions for older adults. If you have questions about work requirements, reporting changes, or required documentation, our office can help determine whether an exemption applies to you and assist in completing and submitting the proper paperwork.

In addition to benefits assistance, Elk Grove Township offers a range of services designed to promote independence, dignity, and well-being — including transportation services, referrals to community resources, and social service support tailored to the unique needs of older residents.

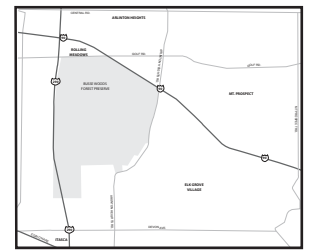

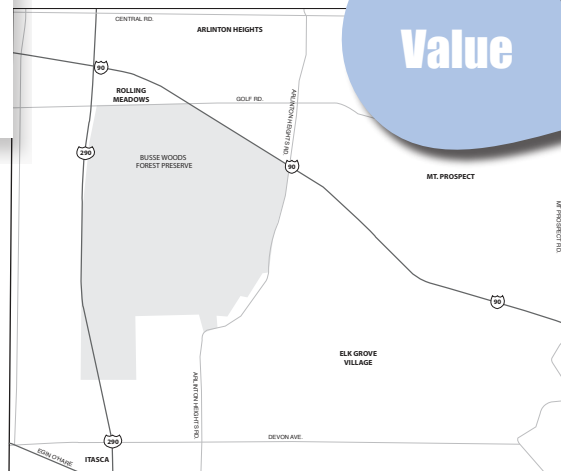
